Her decade’s worth of experiences working with small, rural agencies and managing cross-sector programming with multiple county service areas quickly taught her how to streamline operations and leverage resources to meet program demands.

Senn began her career with a love for community found in her role as Servant Leader Intern for the CDF Freedom Schools Program and later began her journey with the non-profit sector as an AmeriCorps VISTA with Habitat for Humanity.

She added, “Far too often, communities are faced with an overwhelming need and very few resources. Being a part of something that provides hope and tools that can make a direct impact feels right.”

In addition to helping organizations optimize existing resources to make the best use of staff time, including mobilizing volunteers and reorganizing program strategy, she has assisted in fundraising efforts and grants, procuring over a quarter million local, state, and national grant dollars for the state of South Carolina.
